Our Curriculum


Our Curriculum is derived upon four key intentions focused upon developing a holistic approach to teaching and learning. We use a consistent lesson structure, across all year groups and subjects to ensure our pupils' curriculum offer allows them to know more and remember more.

Intention 1: Developing our learner's learning (what we learn, skills, knowledge)

Intention 2: Developing the character of our learners (our heart and individuality)

Intention 3: Developing behaviours and habits to become effective learners

Intention 4: Developing the moral compass of our learners (our values)

Our Early Years



Hi, my name is Mrs Kimbley and I am delighted to introduce our Early Years Foundation Stage Unit, comprising of our Nursery and Reception classes.

At Towngate Primary Academy it is our intention that all children are able to achieve their full potential and develop a love for learning as they progress through the school. We have high expectations of all staff and children within the setting, in both Nursery and Reception class. Ensuring that children feel safe and confident is at the heart of establishing a positive learning environment. Through valuing the children's contributions to their curriculum and supporting their thinking, staff aim to move each child's learning forward and encourage them to value their own learning and be reflective. Through our school values and rules, we teach the children to be ready, respectful and safe. We encourage children to develop independence, perseverance and determination and willingness to "have a go", seeing a mistake as a vehicle for learning. We aim to provide a language rich environment, which promotes a love of reading, writing and communication. We plan for all areas of the curriculum, and ensure these are embedded through the learning environment, allowing children to access a range of learning opportunities.

Nursery

Our Nursery setting caters for pupils aged 3 and above, allowing for a smooth and effective transition in preparation for statutory schooling in Reception class. Our staff team place high importance on parental partnership and working together to foster children's interests and identify their unique hobbies and skills. In Nursery we run three sessions daily: morning session (8.50am - 11.50am) afternoon session (12.30pm - 3.30pm) and all day 30 hours provision. Hi, I'm Miss Atkinson and I am the Key Stage Two Leader. Here in Key Stage Two, we strive to give every child an inspiring and motivating school experience as they progress through their academic journey. Our key priorities as children approach Key Stage Two include investing time in preparing and equipping our children to:

- become self-motivated learners;
- develop an enquiring mind, being curious and asking questions to lead our own learning;
- have high aspirations for ourselves and others;
- be independent thinkers and learners;
- demonstrate our core values in our own choices and behaviours, all of the time.

In Lower Key Stage Two, a primary focus is supporting the transition of children from Key Stage One to the junior phase in school. Through effective transition meetings and close communication between teachers, we ensure that all children are well-supported and prepared to take on the journey ahead in Key Stage Two. An exciting aspect of Lower Key Stage Two is the opportunity for children to take their first residential trip; this allows pupils to explore their own resilience, problem solving and independence— attributes we see as essential to build the whole child.

As a member of Upper Key Stage Two, children have the opportunity to apply for various leadership roles in school such as Prefects, Head Boy and Head Girl and Sports Leaders. These are fantastic experiences for the children to help develop their teamwork and leadership skills, focusing on building each individuals' confidence and character in readiness for the next journey into secondary school.

Throughout the year, we look forward to inviting parents and carers through our doors to work alongside the children, as we believe that parent partnership is key to successful development. We are proud to operate an open-door policy and as a parent/carer you can look forward to INSPIRE mornings, curriculum event days, Life Skills sessions, charity fundraisers and school fayres. Regular communication is held between school and parents/carers as pupils in the form of parents' evenings, phone calls and SATs preparation parent meetings - establishing a strong link between home and school for all of our pupils.

Our Academy Office and Admissions Process



If you would like to apply for your child to attend our wonderful school, you will need to contact Wakefield Admissions in the first instance. They can be reached by phoning 01924 306052 or by emailing them on admissions@wakefield.gov.uk.

Admissions will then get in touch with us to check our capacity in each class, if we do have spaces to accommodate your child, Admissions will then send you an offer letter. Once you have received your offer letter, you can then contact us and we can arrange a date for your child to start with us and we will give you all the information you need to join our school community.

Academy Uniform

Children are proud to wear the Towngate Primary uniform; wearing a uniform has many benefits such as giving a sense of belonging and unity. Our uniform provider is 'The Box' which is located in Ossett Town centre.

Our children are asked to wear the following uniform:

- Navy blue jumper or cardigan
- White polo shirt/formal shirt
- Grey or black trousers, skirt or pinafore dress
- Blue and white check summer dresses
- Black or grey socks for boys
- Grey, black or white tights for girls or white socks
- Black school shoes
- PE kit consists of trainers, black shorts and white round neck t-shirt, plain jogging bottoms and a plain jumper (outdoor only)

Jewellery: Children may only wear stud earrings if they have pierced ears. Children may also wear a watch. Children are not permitted to wear any makeup or nail varnish.

Please ensure that your child's clothing has their name written **clearly** in ALL items.



About Our School

Our school is nestled within the locality of Ossett, Wakefield; a rural space at the heart of the community in which we serve. We are fortunate here at Towngate to reside in a private location with large outdoor space available to us for our learning.

Our school boasts a 'Good' judgement from Ofsted, July 2019 which highlighted the following strengths of the school:

- The school shows energetic leadership, dedicated staff and strong support from the Academy Trust.
- High quality teaching of early reading, phonics and mathematics, where pupils make good progress in reading, writing and mathematics as a result of good teaching.
- A curriculum which develops pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural awareness well which contributes to good personal development and welfare and where pupils behave well both in lessons and outdoors.
- Children thrive in the early years as a result of good teaching, fun activities and focus on developing the essentials of communication and literacy.
- There is a rich menu of extra-curricular activities on offer where pupils enjoy participating in music and sports.



The school is lucky enough to have many links with the local community and wider organisations including Inspire Partnership Multi Academy Trust and the schools working within our trust, Kings Way Church and Huddersfield Giants Rugby. We boast a range of clubs both in school and after school available to the children. These include the School Council, the Eco Team, British Values Ambassadors, Anti-Bullying Ambassadors, sporting and mathematics clubs. Here at Towngate we even have our very own Towngate Mascot - Shelley the tortoise - who has been funded through fundraising activities by our academy Eco team.

We are supported by our wonderful PTA who organise a range of exciting activities in school for us to enjoy including the Christmas Fayre, the Summer Fayre and Easter events and support our plans in order to make our school the fantastic place it is for children and staff alike.



Before and After School Club

We are proud to offer a fantastic Breakfast and After School club here at Towngate Primary Academy. These sessions are tailored to meet the needs of parents/carers who require additional provision either side of the school day, where the children can thrive in a safe and stimulating atmosphere with their peers.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club in the academy hall each morning from 7.45am to 8.50am. where we strive to make each morning a positive experience for all of our children in attendance. At Towngate Primary Academy, we are committed to providing healthy and balanced food to start the day, therefore at Breakfast Club, the children are provided with a choice of cereals (Cornflakes, Rice Crispies, Shreddies and Cheerios), fruit, toast and a cold drink. The children are provided with games, activities and books and are fully supervised whilst attending Breakfast Club. They are then escorted to their classrooms ready for the start of the school day.

After School Club

Our club Manager is Mrs S Johnson who is supported by Ms Snowden, Mrs Harvey and Miss Fallon over the course of the week. Whilst attending our club, children will participate in a range of exciting activities including tech, sports, arts and crafts and even baking! There are two sessions available, Session 1 is from 3.15pm to 4.30pm and includes a healthy snack and drinks for your child and Session 2 runs from 3.15pm to 6.00pm and includes a meal and drinks for your child.
