Key Stage 1 – Year 1

Happy new to everyone! This week in Year 1, we have been learning about a new author called Beatrix Potter. We are really enjoying learning the story Peter Rabbit in our English work. We have practised writing capital letters for names and we are learning to write the beginning of a story using the traditional starter of 'Once upon a time'. In Maths, we have been learning how to count on from the greatest number. We have done this by putting the greatest number in our head and counting on. We used a number line to find the greatest number and count on. In Science, we started our new topic on materials and began to think about words such as transparent, opaque, durable and waterproof. We enjoyed identifying materials and discussing their properties. In Geography, we are learning to name and locate the four countries of the UK using maps. Year 1 love to use the atlases to explore different countries. Have a lovely weekend.

Key Stage 1 – Year 2

Welcome back Year 2 and a Happy New Year! The children have made an excellent start to the new half term and have been working extremely hard. We started our new book, 'The Velveteen Rabbit' this week and have written our own letters in the character of the Rabbit. The children are showing tremendous amounts of resilience when writing independently and including some key features to their writing. In Maths, we have been learning about money and how we can make an amount in different ways with different coins. We have started our new Geography topic, where we will be comparing England to Kenya. We located both countries on a world map and described what kind of places we thought they were, using satellite images. We went on a Nature Walk around school after looking at this week's Picture News question - "Should more of our learning take place outside?". We reflected on how fortunate we are to be surrounded by nature at Towngate. Well done to all our children for a fantastic start to this half term!

Lower Key Stage 2 – Year 3

This week Year 3 have returned to school with a very positive attitude and have worked extremely hard in all of their learning. This week we have begun work on our new class story, 'Voices in the park'. The children have read through the first voice's perspective and have begun creating a police report detailing the terrible events which often happen in the park. In our maths lessons the children have begun using long multiplication to solve tricky questions. This method is difficult and has several steps which the children have practised well. Knowing our times tables has supported this learning, so please keep practising at home. In History we used a scaled timeline to begin understanding the chronology of the Shang Dynasty and which periods of history it is concurrent with. Finally, in our Science lesson this week the children have begun learning about sound. In particular we have looked at vibrations and how they affect particles. Furthermore, we have annotated a diagram of an ear as we begin to understand how it helps us hear sound. A super first week back from Year 3, well done everyone!

Lower Key Stage 2 – Year 4A

Upper Key Stage 2 – Year 5

We have thought about what life was like in Edwardian London and how the era impacts the storyline. We have looked at a person specification for the job of nanny to the Banks' family and drafted written our own version. In computing, we have studied text-based adventure games and have practised using text code on Python. Our science unit is 'Electrical Circuits' and we have begun this learning by looking at what static electricity is, how it is generated and the potential dangers it may pose.


Upper Key Stage 2 – Year 6
