Lower Key Stage 2 – Year 4A

Lower Key Stage 2 – Year 4B

Upper Key Stage 2 – Year 5

This week, in year 5, we have continued our fractions learning. We have been taught by Miss Walker and have looked at adding and subtracting mixed numbers. We have looked at developing our reasoning and problem solving skills to help us to explain how we found an answer and to spot and correct errors. In English, we have published our non-chronological reports on the different experiences of women through the ages and started to look at the features of our new text type. In science, we have investigated what happens when we change components in a circuit to further our knowledge of electricity. In geography, we have learned what makes the tundra and taiga biomes unique by looking at the flora and fauna that can survive in these ecosystems. Our PE unit, invasion games, has continued with handball, we have looked at some specific shooting and passing techniques and applied these in game situations.

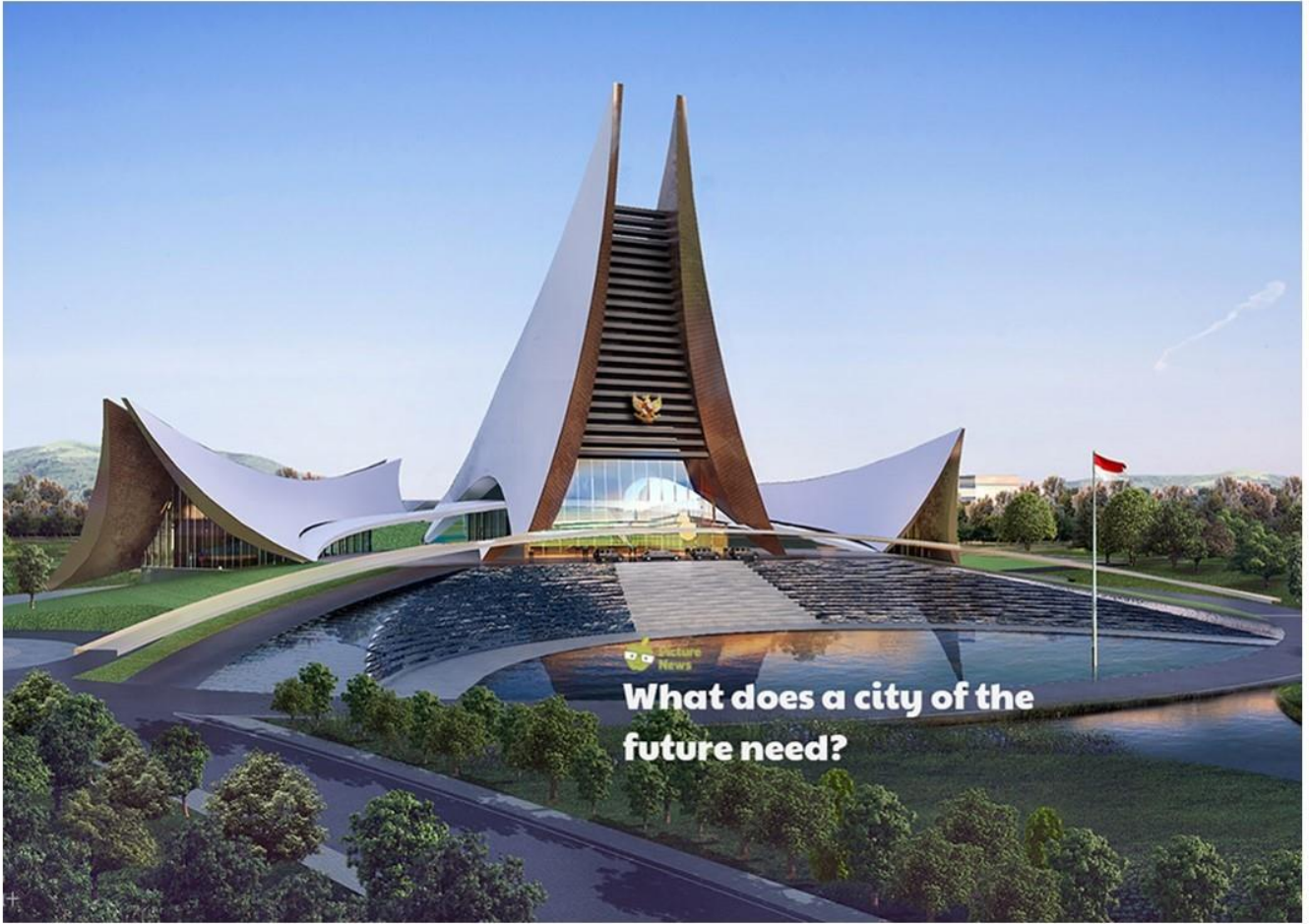
