Key Stage 1 – Year 1

Lower Key Stage 2 – Year 3

This week Year 3 have been working super hard across all their subjects. In English we have written an information leaflet all about tectonic plates and how earthquakes occur. The children used different picture sources to help them structure their writing and they all tried hard to keep it factual yet grammatically interesting. In DT this week the children have begun to experiment with building circuits so they can plan their siren. The children are planning and developing a siren which would be suitable for a variety of purposes and are experimenting with different circuits before designing their own. In Geography, we learned about the formation of mountains and fold mountains. The children are now expanding their understanding of tectonic plates and how their movement helps to shape the world around us. For international women's day, the children learned about Amelia Earhart, and her quest to become the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. Another super week from Year 3.

Upper Key Stage 2 – Year 5

This week, in year 5, we have completed our work on fractions by multiplying mixed numbers by integers. We have looked at some problem solving and reasoning with fractions and have developed the ability to explain our thinking. The setting description portrays a dystopian landscape in which the 'OTHERS' have destroyed most of the natural world. In PE, we have continued to develop our kabaddi skills by working on key components of fitness such as agility and balance. We have played small sided games in which to practise our new skills. In art, we have used scale and tonal perspective to create a 3-D effect for our landscapes. Our music specialist has continued to work with the children to work on writing music notation and practising playing a range of different instruments.
