Early Years – Foundation 2 (Reception)

F2 have had a super week this week. We have enjoyed reading our class story, The Little Red Hen, and we have been thinking about being on a farm and different baby animals. F2 have been thinking about numbers past 10 and thinking about how we can count large groups of objects accurately. We have also enjoyed finding out how to make an egg float during our science lesson.

Key Stage 1 – Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have been reading a poem called 'Animals on Show'. We worked really hard to answer retrieval and inference questions and our new learning was to focus on vocabulary in the poem, finding out about new words such as outstanding and magical kingdom. In maths we have been using the words longer, shorter and taller to describe and compare length and height. We really enjoyed using a ruler to measure objects around the classroom in cm. In science we learnt how to plant a bean and found out about new scientific words - germination and hydrated. We all planted a bean and carefully watered it. We are going to observe the seeds and see how long it takes for them to start growing. We decided to have an experiment and have put one planted seed in the cupboard so it has no light. We predict it will not grow. What do you think will happen? Have a lovely weekend.
