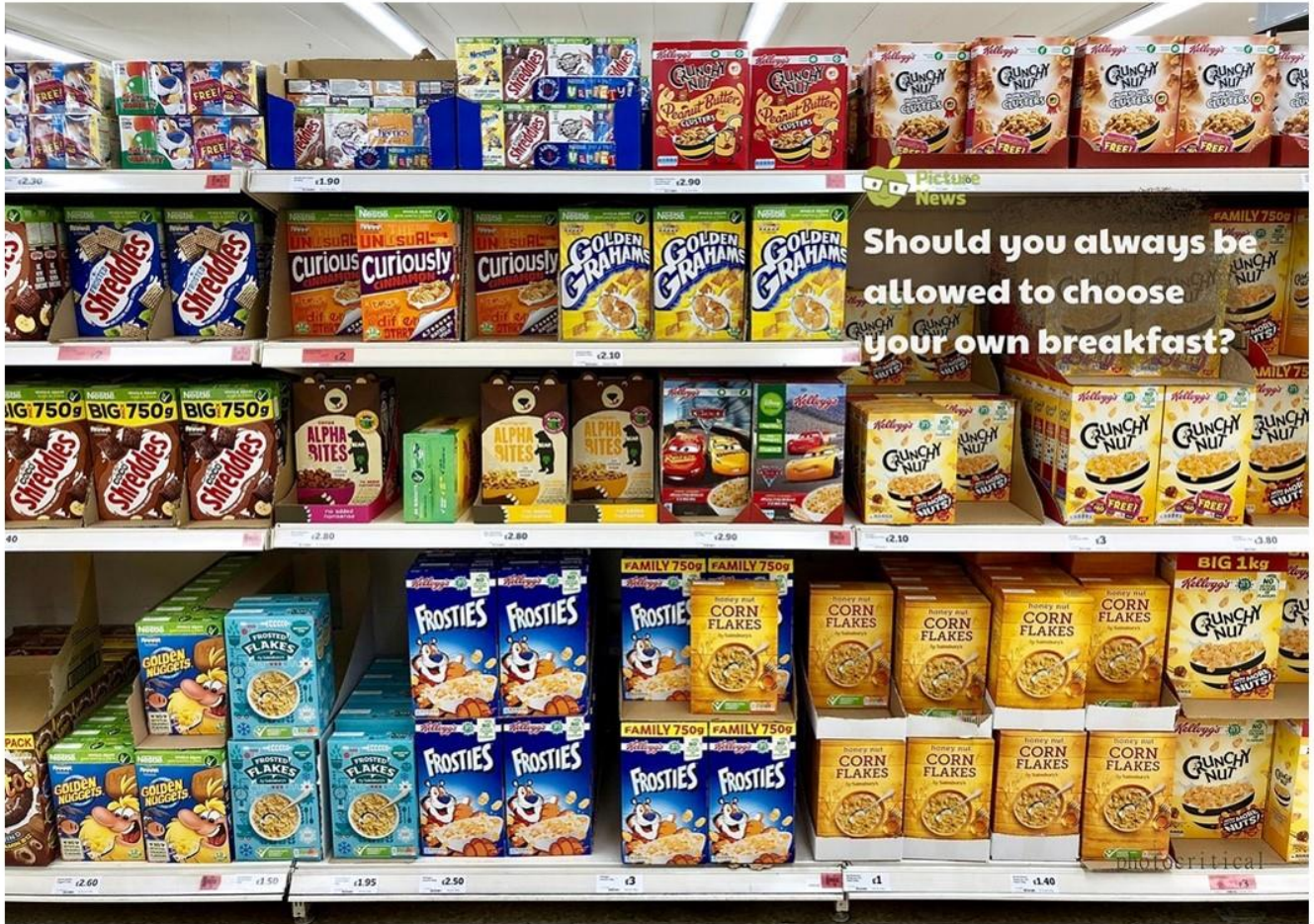
### **Upper Key Stage 2 – Year 6**
