What have we been getting up to this week?

Nursery

This week the children have been introduced to 2 new letters and sounds. They have been learning about the images that start with 't' and 'g'. During Maths the children have been introduced to comparing capacity and looking at containers that are full, half full and empty. This week in topic we are exploring animals in the North Pole and animals that live in the South Pole. The children are gaining a good understanding that penguins live in the South Pole and polar bears live in the North Pole. This week we are sending a letter formation sheet for the children to practice at home. This week's letter is 'a' – the phrase when writing 'a' is 'You go around the apple and down the leaf'. Reception / Year 1

This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1 we have looked at the story 'The Great Explorer' about an adventurer called Tom who travels to the North Pole to find his lost explorer dad. We have used the small world to retell this exciting story and talk about the different animals Tom met on his adventure. We also used our artist skills and painted, drew and modelled these animals, such as polar bears, penguins and walrus. We have also explored ice with our very own icebergs in the classroom. We can use scientific vocabulary to describe how the ice feels, why it is frozen and what happens when ice is warmed up. In PE we continued to explore gymnastics and had a go at climbing and balancing using the apparatus. We also practised safe jumping from a range of heights, bending our knees to make sure our jumping is safe. In Maths we consolidated our knowledge of 5 and 6 using a range of resources. We really have had a super busy week!

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have been busy continuing to explore place value in Maths. We now know how many tens and ones are needed to make the numbers 10 to 20 and can show this in a variety of representations. We are now looking at part models to partition a number into tens and ones using diennes, numicon and counters. We are also drawing pictorial drawings to show our understanding. In Geography we have started learning about the United Kingdom. We can now name the four countries of the UK and are beginning to learn the capital cities of these countries. We used an atlas to help us explore the UK and the surrounding seas. We have continued to explore printing in art this week. We had great fun using natural objects such as sticks, leaves and sponge to make prints using paint. Some of us were even able to print a rainbow coloured leaf because we carefully painted different colours onto the leaf before we printed with it. Very creative, well done!

Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, we have completed our unit of learning focusing on area and perimeter - in Maths. We have calculated the area and perimeter or rectilinear shapes and discovered how compound shapes can be broken down into shapes we are familiar with, before finding the area. We have completed reasoning and problem-solving questions with the Y6 children working hard on SATs style questions. Y5 children have created a bird's-eye view map of a theme park to apply their knowledge of area and perimeter. In English, we have analysed a flashback through a narrative. We have identified the features of a flashback and planned our own writing using the descriptosaurus to magpie key figurative language examples. In Art, we have completed some pencil sketches of animals, choosing the appropriate grade pencil for the desired shadow and highlight. In geography, we have learned about how globalisation is impacted by communication and how the developing world's access to internet connection compares to the developed worlds. In computing, we have continued to develop our own websites ready to publish them.
