Year 1

This week in Year 3, we have worked hard on our multiplication and division skills in Maths. We are currently focusing on the 3 and 4 times tables. In DT, we have practised our sewing skills and have learnt how to create a running stitch and a cross stitch. In French, we have continued to learn how to ask questions in French and can now hold a simple conversation in French with each other. Well done on another fantastic week Year 3!

Year 4

Year 5

What a wonderful week it has been! This week, in English, Year 5 have analysed the features of a poem and started to plan and write their own. We are continuing to use our core text, 'The Island', as the inspiration for this. The class have worked hard to include new grammar skills that we have developed so I can't wait to read these! In Maths, we have learnt how to add and subtract fractions by finding common denominators; everybody has shown amazing resilience towards this. In Science, we have completed a practical experiment to investigate soluble and insoluble solutions. Enjoy your weekend Year 5, you have worked so hard! **Miss Wilson**

Year 5/6

This week, in Year 5/6, we have furthered our knowledge of fractions by finding factions of amounts. We have practised dividing the amount by the denominator and then multiplying our answer by the numerator. We discussed how this doesn't change our answer for a unit fraction as we are multiplying by 1. We have applied our new learning to different contexts by completing some reasoning and problem-solving questions which cause us to think a little deeper and demonstrate our knowledge clearly. In English, we have analysed the features of a free verse poem. We have discussed what makes this different from many other types of poetry, including a haiku and a limerick. In Science, we have looked at what the particle structure of pure substances and mixtures looks like and how they compare. In DT, we have developed our initial ideas by using computer-aided design software (Sketchup) to produce a 3-D model of our pulley system, ready to begin prototyping next week!

We have extended our fractions knowledge in Maths this week by learning how to divide fractions and find fractions of an amount.
