The children have had a busy week of learning this week. In Maths, we have been learning about weight. Reception / Year 1

This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1 we have continued our exploration of our world through the story 'Dear Earth'. This story explores different habitats all over the world so we used our super knowledge of adjectives to describe the different places in the story. We then applied this throughout our provision, painting wonderful seascape pictures, detailed jungle drawings and fantastic sentences using our super adjectives. Linking to this week's picture news we then talked about taking care of our wonderful planet and how we can do this through recycling, reducing water use and tidying up after ourselves. In Maths we continued to consolidate our understanding of 6 and 7, exploring different compositions of these number in a range of ways.

Year 1

This week we have been continuing to learn about place value in Maths. We have been using a whole part model and base ten equipment to make teen numbers, thinking about how many tens and how many ones. We extended this with numbers to 50. In English we found out that in our classic fiction book, Peter Rabbit, mummy rabbit gives her little bunnies lots of commands. We practised writing command sentences in our writing this week. In Art we made our own relief printing block and made a print with it on paper, extending our printing techniques. In Science we used the scientific vocabulary, vertebrate and invertebrate, and explored what these words mean. We then identified animals with and without a backbone. We also know how important it is to protect our spine.
