Nursery

This week the children have looked in great detail at the woodland's habitat. We have been learning about how it is different to the jungle, comparing the weather and the animals that live there. Reception / Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have been working on our final exploration of relief block printing in art. To extend our learning we have used 2 block prints and planned a repeating pattern. Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, we have completed our writing unit focusing on a diary entry from the perspective of the main character in our class book - Once Upon a Hillside. We engaged in some peer assessment and made improvements to our writing using the success criteria we had previously created. In maths, Y6 have looked at ratio and how to scale up or down a ratio. We looked at real life problems to apply our knowledge to varied contexts. Y5 children have looked at identifying and calculating percentages of amounts. In geography, we have continued our work on globalisation by discussing how this has impacted the food trade. We have discussed how food manufacture and distribution has been improved through developments in technology. In science, we calculated the speed of our class mates over a 20m course using an equation and discussed how speed, time and distance are all linked together. In art, we began to create our final pieces by completing some ink prints, background washes and pencil sketches.
