<u>Year 5</u>

We have worked very hard this week in Year 5 for our final week of term! In Maths, we have looked at converting fractions to decimals and percentages; everyone worked so hard to understand this new skill. We then applied this to reasoning and problem-solving questions. We particularly focused on the sentence stems that we used to answer reasoning questions. In English, we have produced some wonderful character descriptions for our last write, based on our book, Once Upon a Hillside - we wrote about a spirit that our key character may potentially meet. We all tried extremely hard to include lots of parenthesis in our writing and this certainly paid off! In Science, we had a super lesson which involved gathering our own data. We went outside in teams and timed one another running a 20m distance, then we worked out how fast each other ran in metres per second using a scientific equation. In RE, we have focused on Hinduism this week, looking at their place of worship (the Mandir) and understanding what the important features are of these buildings. What a wonderful week and half-term we have had Year 5. Thank you for all of your hard-work, I am so proud of you all. Have a lovely half-term and a well-earned rest.

Y<u>ear 5/6</u>

This week, in Y5/6, we have continued to work on our character descriptions in English. We have written character descriptions which focus on giving the reader a really clear picture of the spirit that Tani discovers whilst she is at the pool in the forest. We have used the Descriptosaurus to gather effective figurative language and to develop our ideas for writing. We have self-assessed and peer-assessed our writing to ensure we have produced work which really demonstrates our ability. In Computing, we have continued to develop our websites by using 'Google Sites' to add external links to our content. We discussed the implications of linking to external content and completed on online quiz using a Microsoft Form to demonstrate our understanding. In Science, we have calculated the kinetic energy of an object using the equation: 1/2xmass². This allowed us to compare the kinetic energy of objects by altering the mass or the speed the object was travelling at. **Mr Adlington**
