Reception / Year 1

A brilliant first week back to school for Reception and Reception/Year 1. We have begun our half term unit of growth and change through exploring the story of 'Jasper's Beanstalk', discussing how plants grow and planting our own garden in the outdoor area. We compare this story with the traditional tale 'Jack and the Beanstalk' too and talked about what Jasper could do next after his beanstalk had grown. Alongside this we have been exploring the parts of a plant and their important jobs in helping plants grow. We could identify lots of different types of plants that all have an important role in our environment, e.g. giving us food, giving wildlife a home, making our environment beautiful. We have really loved exploring this topic and can't wait to delve deeper into this in the coming weeks. In maths we have bridged 10 and began looking at teen numbers and their composition. We can talk about what makes a teen number and what the units in the numbers represent – 13 is made of 1 full 10 and 3 ones. We are super mathematicians! Amazing hard work this week in Reception and Reception/Year 1.


