This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1 we have looked at the story 'A Seed in Need'. This story explores the life cycle of a seed, which has inspired lots of scientific talk about how plants grow and change. We used what we had learnt to do an investigation into growing plants and what they needed to grow. We also created a plant diary and wrote about each stage of the plant life cycle. Outside we have done some gardening and planted our own seed garden full of exciting plants, such as peas, carrots, spring onions and flowers. We have also created our own Café and worked as chefs, waitresses and hostesses, creating our menu to serve imaginary goodies to our classmates and teachers. In maths we have continued our learning of teen numbers and focused on ordering numbers, odds and evens and noticing patterns in a number grid. We have had a week full of imagination, investigation and inspiration!

Year 1

This week Year 1 having been learning how to write a poem using descriptive language. We looked at a picture of the ocean and sea and used adjectives to describe the setting. In French, we have been learning different hobbies and how to say we play and in Art, we are planning a Coronation scene using malleable materials with moving characters using stop motion. Year 5

This week, in Year 5, we have written our own free-verse poem about the setting of the Tower Block in our core text. These were utterly beautiful to read; everyone incorporated some wonderful figurative and emotive language to describe the past memories that were created there. In Maths, we have demonstrated excellent resilience to master finding angles on a straight line and also around a point. Firstly, we developed our knowledge through fluency questions and then applied this knowledge to reasoning and problem-solving questions. We applied some super map-reading skills in our Geography lesson which was all about why Geographers use maps and how they assist them in fieldwork. In RE, we used our chromebooks to understand what Christians, Hindus and non-religious people believe about having a soul: we found some interesting differences in these beliefs. On Monday, we were also lucky enough to have a visit from the NSPCC who delivered a workshop on 'speaking out' to stay safe. They shared some really insightful information on children's rights and the wonderful work that Childline do. In PE, we have continued to work hard on our batting and bowling skills through some more exciting games! Thank you for all of your commitment and dedication again this week Year 5, enjoy your weekend.

Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, we have continued our study on our geography unit which looks at fieldwork skills that geographers use to conduct research. In this week's lesson, we learned about maps. We looked at the different types of maps that are available and discussed the benefits of each map for geographers. We learned a new word 'topographic' which related to physical features being represented on a map. We also investigated how contour lines can help us understand whether the land is steep or flatter depending on how close together those lines are. In computing, we continued to develop our E-safety awareness by playing our CEOP game. We also used scratch to explore how conditional statements can be used to influence the outcome of coding. We experimented changing conditions using 'If...then...else' blocks which enabled us to make simple games. In science, we looked at the main organ systems of the body in readiness for the next lesson which breaks down what organs, tissues and cells are in more detail.

In year 6 this week, we have continued to work extremely hard preparing for our upcoming SATs. We have been revising key concepts in maths and working together to problem solve by coaching our peers. 
