# Year 1

# Year 2

We have had a great start to the final half term in Year 2. This week we have been doing some descriptive writing in English, using some fantastic vocabulary. In Maths we have been looking at weighing, measuring in grams and kilograms. We then continued to practice our song - Try everything by Shakira. The school nurse came to talk to us about sun safety. She was impressed with how much we knew about keeping our self-safe so we don't get sun burn or become unwell from too much sun.
