## Reception / Year 1

This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1 we have explored the story of 'The Snail and the Whale'. We have talked about where in the world we would visit if we got a lift from a whale. We wanted to go to Turkey, to the beach and even to the moon! We then practiced our independent writing, drafting postcards to our chosen destination along with a detailed picture. In maths, we have consolidated our knowledge of number bonds to 5 and 20, as well as odds and evens. We have continued to enjoy the outdoor space, even in the downpour of Tuesday, making shelters and caves, as well as planning and playing exciting football matches. Another super week for Reception and Reception/Year 1!

#### Year 1

This week in Year 1, we have been finding out how to find a quarter of a shape and a quarter of an amount. Some children in class linked this to the 4 times table and were able to solve a challenge that needed this knowledge. We are beginning to find out that 2 quarters is the same as a half, ready for Year 2 learning. In English, we have continued the story 'Seeds of Friendship' and have retold the beginning of the story in our own words. We were all so proud of our writing and are working so hard to improve our handwriting and presentation. In history we looked at how transport has changed over time, matching an old vehicle to its equivalent modern version. We linked our history work to picture news which asked the question - How has transport changed our lives? We looked into the future and talked about how many thinks that in 10 years' time we will be able to travel from London to Australia in 2 hours! Watch this space! Well done Year 1, you have all worked super hard.

#### Year 2

We had a very exciting start to the week with our class trip to Askham Bryan Wildlife & Conservation Park where we enjoyed a workshop looking at different creatures, animal skulls and fossils. We explored the park in the sunshine, looking at all the different animals. Our favourite animal was the lemurs who were sunbathing! In English we wrote a recount of our fun day out, adding lots of detail and descriptive language. We have continued to look at measuring in Maths, looking at how we measure liquids and the difference between volume and capacity.

In History, we looked more in depth at Rosa Parks and the events that lead to the bus boycott, including how Martin Luther King was involved. In PSHE, we discussed the feelings we may have when we lose something or someone moves away. We shared our own experiences of when we had lost something and how it felt when we found it again. We have been learning about what causes a change in state of a solid in Science. To help us understand, we held an ice cube and was surprised at how quickly it started to change into a liquid. Well done Year 2!

#### Year 3

This week in Year 3, we have worked hard during our English lessons, writing a character description about the main character in our new book. In Maths, we have identified and compared right, acute and obtuse angles. Ask us how to make a right-angle checker! In Geography, we have learnt what a fold mountain is and how they are formed. In French, we have used our prior knowledge to build sentences about fruit and food. In Science, we have learnt about how we classify animals based on their diets. We have learnt about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores and what they eat. During Forest School, we practised our whittling skills and in PE we worked on our long-distance running skills. We had a very important assembly about water safety on Wednesday, we can now identify the flags and danger signs we might see around open water spaces and know what to do if we get in trouble near water. Another super week Year 3, well done!

#### Year 4

Year 4 have been working really hard this week on their character descriptions in English. We have been describing Bjorn Sigurdsson, a fierce brutal Viking warrior who also has a softer side and in Maths we have been working on 12 hour and 24-hour clock and converting times. In Science, we have been learning about the major bones in our body and why we need them and in Geography, we have been learning about the increased usage of the world's natural resources and why this is happening. In PSHE, we have been learning about hormones and why our moods change as we move into puberty and in French, we have been learning how to say items of clothing. Well done for another busy week Year 4!

#### Year 5

We have had another busy but wonderful week in Year 5! In English, we have worked incredibly hard to re-draft and improve our job advertisements. We have also read more of our book, Peter Pan, and answered some challenging inference and explanation comprehension questions. In Maths, we have been learning how to order and compare negative numbers: everyone has worked incredible hard in applying their knowledge to some tricky problem-solving questions. In Science, we looked at how different diets impact the environment. We used newspaper articles to explore and understand the views around the impact of a variety of foods. In Music, we have developed our skills in reading music to follow and play sequences with instruments. In RE, we enjoyed a creative lesson in which we created a timeline to represent when, how and why a range of religions started: the result of these were wonderful! #### Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, we have continued our learning which focuses on the history of the Middle East. We have learned why different religions have legitimate claims to the importance of the Middle East, including Judaism, Island and Christianity. We have consolidated our knowledge of the area known as Mesopotamia through our daily review of previously taught content. In English, our Y5 children have written a formal advertisement for an Edwardian nanny to help the Darling family from the classic fiction book 'Peter Pan'. Our science lesson has investigated why people with different lifestyles need different diets by identifying the calorific input vs the calories burnt through exercise and activity. With the hot weather lasting, we have watched a live workshop which explained the dangers of swimming in open water to ensure we stay safe whilst having fun this summer.
