#### Vonr 1

This week in Year 1 we had an amazing 2 days doing bike ability. We started on the balance bikes and progressed to the pedal bikes. The children who learnt to ride a bike were so proud of themselves. The children who could already ride a bike learnt new skills too. Thank you to Phil for leading this activity - we have written our thank you letters with beautiful detailed pictures. We hope you like them Phil. In maths, we have revisited learning place value but this time with numbers to 100. We have been making 2-digit numbers using base ten to understand which digit is tens and which is ones. In History, we found out about the history of cars and why Henry Ford is a significant figure in the development of the assembly line and mass production making it cheaper for more people to buy cars. For our homework the children were asked to find out about the railway station in Ossett which was located on Station Road. We now know when it was built, when it closed and why it closed. Super history detectives Year 1!

#### Year 2

This week in Maths we have been looking at tally charts and pictograms, drawing our own and interpreting the data. In English we wrote a letter as Tuffy from our class text, Diary of a Killer Cat. Tuffy is a very cheeky cat who keeps getting himself into mischief! In PE we enjoyed a cosmic yoga adventure to the story Encanto. We stood in all the different yoga poses to tell the story. We used SketchUp during Computing to design our push and pull toys that we will be making in DT. We conducted an experiment in Science to see which items were more soluble, ensuring we made it a fair test. In PSHE we looked at how male and female bodies are different, labelling the different parts, and discussed how our body belongs to us. We made thank you cards in RE to show kindness and discussed how if everyone followed the golden rule - Do unto others how you would have them do unto you - the world would be a much nicer place. Following on from Emeline Pankhurst in History, we looked at Emily Davidson who was another suffragette fighting for votes for women. She tragically died after throwing herself in front of the King's horse while she was protesting.

We were very lucky to have our first parent reader, Mr Fisher, share the story of The Runaway Pea with us and are looking forward to next week's reader already! Another busy week Year 2, well done! Have a lovely weekend.

#### Voar 3

This week in Year 3, we have been very busy working on our knowledge of shapes this week. We have learnt what a quadrilateral is and have practised drawing polygons using rulers. In English, we have written instructions on how to deliver Master Aritson's play. In Geography, we have looked at how earthquakes occur and the catastrophic consequences they can have. In DT, we have looked at different type of levers and made our own example. In PSHE, we have learnt about the PANTS rule. #### Year 4

This week in Year 4, we have been busy writing a newspaper report in English about a vicious attack at the Viking village that caused a horrendous fire and in Maths, we have been learning how to recognise triangles. In Geography, we have been learning about the natural resources in Chile and in Science, we have been learning if all teeth are the same and their function. In PE, we have been practising our fabulous dance routine and practising for sports day. On Monday, we had the most amazing trip to Murton Park where we dressed as Vikings for the day, complete with spear and shield. We defended our village, made oil lamps, ground flour to make our own bread, played Viking games and even learned some Viking words. Well done Year 4 for a fantastic week!

#### Year 5

This week in English, we have produced some absolutely incredible narratives about an adventure to Neverland with Peter Pan and Tinkerbell. We have looked at how to convert different lengths and time - a very helpful life skill! In Computing, we have continued to master programming by implementing movement into our coding. We used our knowledge of degrees and compasses to control our programmes. Finally, in PE, we have continued to develop our athletic skills for Sports Day, as well as adding more counts onto our dance routine. This week we created our own section of a dance to express our own identities through movement. Another fun-filled week, with lots of incredible learning taking place. #### Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, our DT lesson developed our ability to effectively communicate design ideas, using computer aided design (CAD). We used Sketchup software to begin converting our initial sketches into 3D computer generated designs. This allowed us to make changes to our ideas efficiently and gave us the opportunity to view our product from many different angles. In maths, our Y5 children have calculated the volume of 3D shapes; firstly, by counting cubic centimetres, then by using the calculation  $L \times W \times H$ . We solved problems by breaking down questions into more easily manageable steps and worked logically, ensuring we demonstrated our thoughts in our working out. In English, we have written our own narratives based on our class book - Peter Pan - we have edited and improved our work by peer assessing. In science, we have learned about what happens to the body during exercise and the impact of exercise on the circulatory system.
