Transition Meetings

Reception / Year 1

This week in Reception and Reception/Year 1 we have looked at the story of 'Billy's Bucket' which followed on nicely with our learning about under the sea! We pretended we had our own buckets and wrote descriptions and drew detailed pictures of all the sea life we would have in our buckets, such as purple mermaids, orange octopi, stripy fish etc. We used our fantastic imagination and creativity to make our own sea life puppets for moving pictures and used the small world to create our own underwater kingdoms. In Maths we have continued to consolidate our knowledge of length, capacity and weight. We have conducted our investigates within the classroom, using rulers and tape measures, to find who has the biggest hands in our class. We read the stories 'My Shadow is Pink' and 'My Shadow is Purple' and wrote words and drew pictures to show our support, acceptance and love for all those who feel they are different!

In computing we have been comparing different programmes that produce the same outcome and deciding which is more efficient. Year 3

We had a lovely visit to Kingsway Church on Thursday to complete activities based around mindfulness and well-being. We behaved exceptionally well during our walk and visit, outstanding behaviour Year 3! Finally, we have ended our week with a lovely day today to celebrate the end of Pride. We have looked at the book 'Uncle Bobby's Wedding' and written a diary entry imagining that we attended the wedding. What a lovely, very busy week! Year 4

This week in Year 4, we have been planning a newspaper report about a fire in a Viking village and in Maths we have been learning about turns and angles. In Science, we have continued our topic on anatomy, comparing how human anatomy and the anatomy of animals has similarities and differences and in RE, we have been learning about miracles and how in Christianity Jesus fed the 5,000. In French, we have been learning now to write a sentence containing a noun, verb and adjective about clothing and in PE, we have been perfecting our dance routine. On Thursday, it was RSE Day and we talked about how an act of kindness can colour your world and we discussed the kindness shown to Lewis Capaldi during Glastonbury when he was struggling with his mental health. We had a visit to Kingsway Church to take part in mindful activities and take some 'time to think' and we also dressed in bright colours today to represent our individuality and uniqueness. Year 5

This week in Year 5, in English, we have mastered using progressive tense and have applied this to different reasoning questions. We will continue this unit of conversion next week when we will begin to look at imperial lines. In Science, we had an incredibly interesting lesson about the effect of exercise on our body, both our muscles and circulatory system; we carried out an experiment to understand the feeling of these effects. In PE, we have continued to progress our athletic skills so that we are prepared for sports day! Year 5/6

This week, in Y5/6, we have celebrated 'pride month' by completing some activities to help better educate ourselves in relation to world events. We have completed some artwork to evidence our knowledge and paired this with writing to explain our thoughts. In science, we have looked at the how diets can impact the environment, linking to our geography unit - globalisation. In maths, Y5 children have been learning how to convert between units of measure. We began with metric units, converting centimetres to metres and metres to kilometres. Then, we practised converting imperial units of measure, including pints, pounds and feet. We have solved problems including these measures and developed our ability to reason through using the appropriate mathematical vocabulary. In PE, we practised some of our sports day events and competed in various games as a team.

Year 6
