## Sleep workshop - 27th September 2023

# What have we been getting up to this week?

## Nursery

This week the children have continued to find out about themselves and others, we have been looking at a book called 'All Kinds of People'. At circle time we passed around a box (with a mirror inside) and told the children that inside the box was the most special thing, we then looked to see what colour our eyes and hair was. ### Reception

This week in F2 we have enjoyed another super week! In Maths, we have been looking at groups and sets, sorting objects into the correct groups. In English, we have been looking at the book 'In Every House On Every Street' thinking about our own homes and how they are different from our friends. In provision we have used the construction area to build our own houses and structures. In the modelling area we have also looked at houses and tiles and how we can use playdough and tools to replicate the patterns. We have also been thinking about our families and ourselves, how we have changed over time and how each family is different. What a super week F2, well done!

#### Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have been writing about the story we are reading called Sulwe. We have been learning how to write statement sentences using a capital letter, full stop and finger spaces after each word. We have been thinking about Sulwe's emotions and feelings in the story and how she tells her Mama everything. In maths, we have continued to think about place value looking at 1 more and 1 less, looking at groups comparing by matching and using the vocabulary fewer, more and same. In science, we have been learning about materials that are magnetic. We know how to use the words repel and attract to understand magnetism. In history we compared toys from the Victorian era to the toys we play with now. We enjoyed handling artefacts (toys from the past) and found the cup and ball game very frustrating! In DT we used our sliders we made last week for a purpose and made them into a moving picture.

#### Year 1/2

Another busy week in Class 1/2! We are continuing to use our class book Sulwe to develop our writing skills. The children are checking their sentences make sense, have capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. In PE this week, we applied our dodging skills to a variety of team games! In computing, we have looked at the different uses of technology, including communication, playing, researching and how we can use it to help us. We've continued to compare our lives with Victorian children, this week we have looked at the different toys and games they played. We even had a go at playing with the toys ourselves. We've had a wonderful week in Year 3, working really hard on our diary writing as Dorothy Vaughn our character from the book stimulus 'Hidden Figures' and we have been using synonyms to make our writing more ambitious. In Maths, we have been partitioning numbers to 100 and in History, we have been learning about the 3 periods of the Stone Age; Paleolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic. In Science, we are learning about sedimentary rock and how it is formed and in French, we have been learning numbers to 10. In PSHE, we have been learning about school rules and in RE, we looked at how Christians show their faith in Church. #### Year 4

It has been another exciting week for Year 4. This week, we have been completing our setting description in English and will be redrafting them in the coming days. We have been using number lines in Maths and the class has been successful at solving fluency and reasoning problems involving number lines – well done for some super mathematics! This week, we also revisited our greetings in French and each of us held a basic conversation with a partner. At the close of the week, we will be continuing to design our animal trap camera in DT, carefully considering the properties needed. Thank you, Year 4 for another fantastic week.

#### Year 5

This week, in Y5, we have continued our excellent learning focusing on numbers to 1,000,000. We have learned how to say larger numbers and also how to write them in words and numerals. To embed our learning, we have completed some reasoning and problem-solving activities which included group and paired discussions to ensure our answers we as precise as possible. In English, we have written our own setting descriptions of a dystopian city inspired by the book 'TYGER'. We have worked hard on developing our figurative language to provide the reader with a clear picture of the setting. We have practised creating some similes and metaphors as a group before we applied these to our work independently. In DT, we have developed our design brief and generated some initial ideas for our Anderson shelter, ready to use computer aided design to finalise our ideas. In history, we have discussed how trenches and weapons contributed to the number of lives lost during the Battle of the Somme.

## Mr Adlington

### Year 5/6

In Science this week, we have been learning how to separate mixtures of solids, liquids and gasses using different techniques. In History, we learnt about why so many lives were lost during the war. We explored how weaponry in the war developed over time and the conditions within the trenches. In DT, we are continuing to evaluate the design of air raid shelters and their suitability for use. In maths, we have been exploring negative numbers solving a range of reasoning and problem-solving questions. In our worry warriors' workshop, we spoke about who we could speak to about our worries and different breathing techniques to help us to calm down.

#### Year 6

In Year 6 this week, we have been working hard to re-draft our setting descriptions based on our core text Tyger: we considered aspects of our writing to focus on in our improvements and used our class visualiser to work on editing and improvement aspects of our work collaboratively, before doing so independently.

In Maths, we have worked hard on developing our fluency to calculate using negative numbers in context - well done for your excellent effort. In History, we have worked hard to understand the contributory factors as to how WW1 ended before we explore the Treaty of Versaille next week. I have been very impressed with the class' super science skills as we understood how to separate states of matter. We have been busy practising our 'animal positions' for a flying start with our handwriting lessons and I am beginning to see an improved effort from everyone with your presentation.
