Year 1

Year 1/2

A huge welcome back to all the children in Class 1/2, we hope you had a lovely week off and it is wonderful to see you all back in school ready to start a new half term! We have so many exciting things coming up this half term and this week we have started lots of new topics. In English, we're already enjoying our new class text, 'The Day the Crayons Came Home', where we have written as one of the crayons to his owner Duncan. We're able to write different sentence types and included questions and exclamation sentences. In Science, we're learning all about animals and we went on a nature walk around school to see which different animals we could spot around school. We loved our visit to the pond and look forward to visiting there all year round to see what we can find! We are learning Geography this half term and this week we located the 7 continents. We used the globes and atlases, seeing what we already know and adding to our every growing knowledge of the world! Year 2

This week in English, we had wonderful series of lessons based on our new core text, 'The Day the Crayons Came Home'. The children have worked superbly answering some inference and prediction comprehension questions, learning about exclamation marks, and writing a letter. In maths, our super mathematicians have once again demonstrated admirable resilience. We have used column addition to add two 2-digit numbers, including crossing ten, as well as beginning to subtract two 2-digit numbers. We had a fantastic lesson in Geography, in which we learnt what the continents of the world are and annotated a world map. Our super scientists have been pond dipping too this week! We used scientific equipment to see which insects or water animals we could spot, as well as bird watching, which was fantastic! This is also one of Year 2 promises that we endeavoured for the children to experience. We had a lovely RE lesson, where the children showed respect and interest when learning about sacred books. Finally, have been learning about the importance of Remembrance Day, and why we remember. We decorated poppies in memory of the fallen soldiers. What a super first week back after half-term, have a lovely weekend Year 2!

Year 3

We've had a very busy first week back in Year 3. In English, we began our new text 'The Wild Way Home' about a boy called Charlie who has a baby brother with a poorly heart. He runs into the woods and meets a stone age boy. We will study this text as inspiration to create our own independent writing and in Maths, we have begun learning addition and subtraction across 10 and 100. In History, we began our new topic of 'Villages, Towns and Cities and in French, we have been learning how to ask questions. In Art this week, we have created our own poppies to contribute to a display in school and in Music, we had our first Samba lesson with MrWhitely from Wakefield Music Services. In PE, this week we practiced our throwing and catching skills in readiness for our multi sports topic this half term and in computing, we began our 'creating media' topic by creating our own flip-book. Well done for a great first week Year 3!

Year 4

A fantastic start to the new term in year 4. We have started reading our new English and are preparing to write a character description in the coming week. In Science, we are moving onto states of matter and in PE we are starting our multi-sports unit of work. This week has also seen us perform a poem at the Cenotaph, which Year 4 have taken great pride and responsibility in learning and performing to the best of their ability. I look forward to welcoming you all back after the weekend. **Mr Hitch**



Year 5

This week, in Y5, we have enjoyed settling back into school routines and getting stuck into our new learning. In maths, we have started to look at multiplication and division. We have used commutativity to help us with establishing number facts from a number sentence and have used inverse operations to rearrange equations. We have identified common multiples and discovered how to find factors of integers. In English, we have identified the features of a diary entry, based on our new class book 'Goodnight Mr Tom'. We have discussed the audience, purpose and formality of a diary entry and considered how this will impact our writing. In geography, we have learned what a slum is and where they are located on earth. We discussed what features slums share with modern day cities. Our PE focus is outdoor and adventurous activities and we have focused on orienteering by learning how to use a map to locate key points. **Mr Adlington**

Year 5/6

In Year 5/6 we have been studying our new book Goodnight Mr Tom. We identified the features of a diary – some of which included: fronted adverbials of time, figurative language, informal and personal tone, first person and progressive tense. In maths we finished our learning of long division before exploring how to multiple integers by 10, 100 and 1000. In RE, we looked at life and death and understood different views about heaven. In science we have been learning about gravity and explored what a force is. We made some beautiful poppies as part of our work on remembrance. Well done Year 5/6 for another wonderful week. **Mrs Bateman**

Year 6

We have had a brilliant first week back at school this week – it's almost as though the children have never been away! In English, we have delved straight into our new core text – Goodnight Mr Tom. We used our knowledge from last half term's history unit about Twentieth Century Conflict in developing our interest and understanding of life during World War Two. We began our learning by unpicking extracts of the text, by learning and applying our understanding of progressive and perfect tenses before we explored the features of diary entries – working hard to look at multiple models to support our writing. In Maths, we used various representations to explore the concept of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 ready to unpick some tricky problems next week! In Geography, we launched our learning by exploring where the world's largest sums are located and understanding the characteristics of slums and why people live in these densely populated settlements. The children's behaviour was exemplary as we walked into Ossett to read our poem 'In Flanders Fields' – many members of the community commented on how lovely it was to see the children being so respectful in remembrance.

Well done everyone – you have been a delight (as always!) this week. Mrs Poole


