

## Dear Parents and Carers,

Another week comes to an end many memorable moments having taken place. The children have been busy working hard in their classrooms, collaborating and building resilience in their learning. It's been lovely to – once again – see our children displaying our 'core four' values in all they do.

## Townqate Pantry

In response to our changing community and the continued cost of living crisis, we have established our 'Towngate Pantry' which is located in 'the hive' next to our pastoral room in school. Parents and carers are welcome to come and use the free pantry which houses a range of tinned and dried foods, toiletries and baby essentials. We are in the process of organising clothing which will also form part of this pantry.

If parents / carers would prefer not to come into the school but would appreciate this support, we urge you to speak to a member of staff whom you feel most comfortable to and we can arrange collection of food or clothing from the pantry.

#### Year 1/2

It has been an exciting week in Class 1/2, we have been thinking about .... CHRISTMAS!! Yes, that's right, Christmas has come early for the children in KS1 as we have been learning our Christmas production songs. We are already so excited to share them all with our grown-ups. We have launched a new History topic this week, The Great Fire of London, where we plotted it on a timeline and could see how this was such a long time ago! #### Year 2

Our super mathematicians have been looking at recognising and making equal groups, which we applied to writing repeated addition number sentences. #### Year 4

Another busy week in year 4. This week, pupils have been planning their persuasive adverts in English, looking to include the writing skills we have been practicing. In Maths, we have been subtracting a range of numbers and finding the most efficient method of subtracting different values. In Geography, we have looked at how landforms are created as well as looking at evaporation and condensation in Science. In Art we are continuing to focus on Collage, specifically our significant individuals: Pablo Picasso and Paul Klee. Well done for your hard work this week year 4. #### Year 5

This week, in Year 5, we have continued our learning which focuses on multiplication and division. We multiplied and divided by 10, 100 and 1,000 - using place value charts to practise moving the digits either left or right the required number of times. We have also used our known facts to ensure that we are more comfortable when multiplying multiples of ten by integers. In English, we have analysed the features of an informal letter and discussed the audience and purpose for our writing. We have planned our own example writing from the perspective of one of the characters from our class book: Goodnight Mr Tom. In PE, we have spent more time developing our communication and teamwork through OAA activities where we needed to solve problems by working together. Our geography learning has centred around the comparison of two big slums located in Brazil and India, respectively. We compared total area, population density and the physical characteristics of the land on which they are built.

#### Year 5/6

A super week in year 5/6. In Art, the children have been learning about colour mixing - exploring primary, secondary and tertiary colours along with complementary colours using a colour wheel. In science, we have been investigating the strength of gravity compared to magnetism. In Forest Schools, we have absolutely loved learning about fire safety and making smores - delicious! As part of our Geography curriculum, this week we were comparing slums in different areas of the world; we looked closely at their size, features and location. Have a super weekend everyone, you absolutely deserve it!

#### Year 6

This week has been another great week of fantastic learning. In Maths, we took our learning from finding equivalent fractions, to simplifying, comparing and ordering fractions. It's been really tricky but we are making positive gains in our learning and we will continue to embed our new knowledge prior to adding and subtracting fractions next week! In English, we have prepared to write our informal letters from the perspective of a young evacuee leaving the city for safety in the countryside: we have carefully considered our audience and purpose for writing to ensure our language is appropriate. Well done everyone! In Art, we continue to study our artist – Eduardo Kobra – as part of our holistic understanding of slums within our geography learning. We have compared and contrasted two slum settlements to understand that -although located at other sides of the world – there are many similarities and differences within these settlements. Our Friday extract study this week as part of our reading curriculum was War of the Worlds, written in 1898 by H G Wells. We considered the impact of this archaic language and compared this text to others we have read ourselves. Well done for another brilliant week everyone. I am immensely proud of you for working so hard.
