

Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have been learning to do repeating patterns using 2D and 3D shapes. We explored this by moving the shapes practically into symmetrical and repeating patterns. We have also revisited place value activities focusing on making numbers with tens and ones. We have also revisited doubles and addition and subtraction. In English we have been writing facts about tigers. We used new ambitious words like camouflage and carnivores. We are trying really hard to remember to use capital letters and full stops. We are also trying hard to apply our kinetic handwriting skills into our daily writing.

In history we have been recording how the Great Fire of London spread due to not being able to get to the water in the River Thames. In geography we have been learning about the currency, trade and food in Europe. We have been using the atlas to locate different countries in the north, east, west and southern Europe.

In DT we have been exploring the materials we are going to use to make an animal shelter. We know we will make a cube or cuboid structure and then decide how to add a base, a roof and think about how to make the roof waterproof.

This week in English, we have been learning how to use apostrophes to show contraction. We have worked really hard to use these in our descriptions of Tigers! I have been blown away by the pieces of writing that our class have produced, it is truly heart-warming to see the development in everyone's writing since September, including their handwriting. In Maths, we have worked extremely hard to master comparing amounts of money, including finding the same amount. We started with developing our fluency skills, but then applied this to some very tricky reasoning and problem-solving questions! In Geography, we had a wonderful lesson looking at what Europe is like, in terms of currency, trade and even the food specialities across the continent. We used our learning to role play what happens in different countries and compared how these differed across the continent. In Science, we looked at human life-cycles and how we change throughout our lives. We looked at the different skills we have at each age, and how these develop throughout our lives. In PSHE, we looked at how we can keep ourselves safe by understanding which scenarios we would say "Yes", "No", or "I'll ask a grown up for permission" for. I was extremely impressed by the mature and thoughtful responses that the children offered. Another super week Year 2 - a huge well done! You continue to make me so proud.

This week in Year 3, we have been working really hard planning a character description of Arlo, the main character in our picture book 'Storm in a jar'. We used expanded noun phrases and prepositions to add interest to our writing and in maths, we have been multiplying 2 digits by 1 digit with and without an exchange. In History, we have been learning why the Egyptians built the pyramids and in Science, we have been carrying out an investigation into how friction affects the speed of an object by repelling a toy car on the playground, the carpet and the school corridor- it was great fun and very interesting. Year 6

After another busy week, Year 6 continue to impress us with their commitment and resilience in learning. This week, we have explored the concept of perimeter in maths – looking at compound shapes and using the basic principles of algebra to find missing lengths. In English, we have been editing and publishing our extended writes based on our core text, Windrush Child, where we retell the steps Leonard and his mum took boarding the Empire Windrush in the hope of a new life in England. We thought carefully about our language choices to capture the emotions felt by the characters during this time. In History, we have been comparing the significance of Rosa Parks, Oliver Brown and Martin Luther King Jr in their fight for Civil Rights in 1950s America. The children unpicked and analysed key parts of the iconic speech from Martin Luther King: 'I have a dream'. In Science, we have been exploring the concept of Earth and Space, whilst in Geography we looked at evidencing our understanding of whether Governments can take action to tackle poor living conditions in slums.


