What have we been getting up to this week?

Nursery

This week the children have been learning about another country related to one of our stories 'Poles Apart'. Last week we explored the North and South Pole and Australia looking at the different animals and climates, this week we have been exploring Africa! The children loved the quiz about guessing the animal by giving clues and they learnt some interesting facts about the animals. We looked at some videos of the animals and looked at what made them unique, the particularly liked the Giraffes long tongue and the Hyenas laugh! In maths we have been looking and identifying patterns, we have been matching patterns of animals and looking at patterns that repeat themselves. The children enjoyed working in this area and developing their ideas. All the staff are very proud of how hard the children are working to develop their writing in both their focus lessons, early morning activities and through our Kinetic Letters lessons. This week the children have also continued to show a super knowledge of number, as we have been thinking about the numbers 6,7, and 8 in our lessons.

Your'

This week in Year 1 we have been working really hard to develop our knowledge of place value with numbers from 20 to 50.

We have been partitioning numbers into tens and ones and learning how to add on 10 more to any given number. We have been counting groups of objects in tens to help us count quickly. We used our counting in twos to support this skill. In history we found out that there was no fire service in 1666 when the Great Fire of London happened. We acted out using a fire squirt and carrying a leather bucket down to the River Thames to fill with water and then run back to the fire. We found out that the first fire service started in 1667 but people had to pay for this. In DT we made our animal shelters and then evaluated how the making process had been. In English we wrote a missing poster for Polly the parrot who went missing in the week. We had to describe her feathers and say the things she likes to eat and drink. This week we have worked really hard on our handwriting thinking about how kinetic letter skills. What a super week of learning Year 1. I continue to be very proud of you.

Year 1/2

Another busy week here in Class 1/2, the children have worked extremely hard and taken part in some wonderful discussions and produced some excellent work. We have had a big push this week on handwriting, with many of us embedding our correct letter formation and blowing me away with their fantastic presentation! In English, we have used our knowledge of birds and the grammatical feature of adjectives to write a wanted poster! In Maths, year 1 have been working with numbers up to 50, counting forwards and backwards from different numbers. We are able to say what number comes before and after a certain number. Year 2, have started their work on shape, where they are describing the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. In History, we have analysed sources to help us understand how the fire service has changed over time. We learnt that in 1666, they used fire hooks, fire squirts and leather buckets to try stop the fire! We were shocked to learn that women were only allowed to join the fire service in 1982! We made venn diagrams to think about the fire service then and now. In RE, we have been continuing to learn about Easter and this week we looked at different symbols that are associated with Easter. Well done for your continued hard work Class 1/2, have a lovely weekend!

This week in English, we have worked really hard on our retrieval and inference skills, answering questions about the 'World of Birds' in our Animal Encyclopaedia text. In Geography, we continued to explore what Europe is like, studying what countries make up Europe and what those countries are like.
