


## Arbor communication system

We are learning that 2 quarters is the same as a half and that 2 halves make one whole. We used counters to help find half of an amount and knew that when we find half, we will have 2 equal groups. In geography we are starting to learn about the difference between the weather and the climate. We also talked about the four seasons and which month is in which season. In PE we practised our fundamental movement skills and played in teams to develop cooperation skills. In art we are starting to learn what a collage is and how we can tear paper in different ways and decided how to place the paper for the composition of the art work we want to produce. What a wonderful first week back Year 1! I am very proud of you all.

#### Year 1/2

We have had a very busy first week back in Year 3. #### Year 4

What a brilliant start to the new half term. #### Year 5

This week, in year 5, we have really settled in well to our classroom routines and we have seen excellent learning behaviour being demonstrated. We have had our first lessons taught by our student teacher - Miss Mehmood which has been a nice change from our usual teacher! In maths, we have learned about fractional parts of a whole by looking carefully at hundredths and thousandths. We have discussed what a 'hundredth' and 'thousandth' is and looked at the decimal notation for each of these fractions. We have solved problems by applying our knowledge in new contexts to consolidate our learning. In English, we have looked at the features of a setting description and have planned our own setting description to paint a vivid picture for the reader of the first time Leonard - the main character in our class book - sees snow after moving from Jamaica to England. We have started a new art unit of learning focusing on the use of oil pastels to create a galactic scene which links to our science unit - earth and space. We identified the techniques artists use to generate effects such as perspective and mood in a piece of art. We had chance to replicate this and generate our own ideas in our sketchbooks!

What a fabulous week in Year 5/6 - it's been wonderful to have you all back in school after the break. In Geography, we have continued last term's work around sustainability; the children are sowing excellent knowledge retention and offering thoughtful contributions in lessons.
