May we also offer a gentle reminder that we are a nut-free school and therefore can we request that snacks – such as cereal bars - brought into school for over a break time are nut-free.


Rescheduled Future in Minds session

Year 2

We have also worked incredibly hard practicing for our Year 2 class assembly next Thursday - we can't wait to show this to you. Well done for another super week Year 2 - I am so proud of each and every one of you.

Year 3

In Year 3 this week, we have been retrieving and inferring from a poem about raindrops and then we have been finding the features of an acrostic poem. Year 4

We identified the key features of a flashback and spent some time considering how sentence models can be utilised to up level our work: looking to really impact our audience. In PE, we looked at passing skills in netball by developing our bounce pass and chest pass. We practise these in isolation before combining them in a game situation. In art, we have discussed what makes an effective composition and how artists implement the 8 principles of composition to create impactful pieces.
