Year 2

We've had another busy, enjoyable week in Year 2. In English, we have finished our core text 'Velveteen Rabbit' and have written our own versions of this story, in which we chose our own characters! Year 3

We've had a very busy week in Year 3. In English, we have been writing a setting description based on 'Mole's House' in our new core text 'Wind in the Willows', using fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and figurative language and in Maths, we have been comparing and ordering fractions and learning about fractions and scales. In Science, we gave been learning about the different parts of a flowering plant as part of our new topic 'Plants' and in RE, we have been learning about Hindu Gods. In History, we have been learning about Ancient Greek Gods and in Geography, we have been learning about the Northern and southern hemisphere and why we have seasons. In PE, we practised our bowling and batting skills for cricket and in Computing, we looked at words and pictures to begin our new topic of 'Creating Media - desktop publishing'. Year 4 have been confidently adding and subtracting fractions including mixed numbers in Math's. In English, we have completed some amazing character descriptions about the character Grendel using all of the skills we have used so far this year. In Design Technology we have started our new topic of Healthy and varied diet, this has seen our class analyse products on the current market and we look forward to following our design, make, evaluate process that has seen us already make some fantastic products. Year 5

This week, in year 5, we have continued our work on area and perimeter. We have calculated the perimeter of rectilinear shapes including finding the length of missing sides. We have discussed how to determine whether a question has sufficient information in order to calculate the perimeter and that - sometimes - we need more information before attempting our working out. We have also calculated the area of rectangles and compound shapes by splitting these shapes into more easily recognisable rectilinear shapes. We have completed reasoning and problem-solving questions in order to consolidate our knowledge. In English, we have planned our own monologue based on the poem we have been studying - The Highwayman. We have written from the perspective of Bess, the landlord's daughter, by presenting her thoughts and feelings as they might be performed to the camera or audience. In science, we have studied asexual reproduction in plants looking specifically at how plants can use runner, bulbs and tubers to reproduce without the need for two organisms to be involved. In geography, we have introduced our new unit of learning for this half term which is biomes. We have learned what biomes are and where specific biomes are located on earth. Our PE learning is cricket for this half term and this week we have practised developing our accuracy when throwing, catching and bowling. **Mr Adlington**

Year 5/6

This week, our Year 5 children have continued to develop their learning on angles, exploring angles on a straight line, around a point and drawing angles using a protractor. In Year 6, we have been deepening our knowledge of revised topics and applying these to reasoning problems; the children's arithmetic scores are improving each day and we couldn't be prouder! In RE, we have been learning about Islamic places of worship and the magnificent artwork in these. In History, we have started our new topic about 'Changing Britain' – we are linking our previous learning about Civil Rights in the USA to changes in Civil Rights in Great Britain, with a particular focus on protected characteristics. In English, Year 5 have planned and written their own monologue based on the poem 'The Highwayman'. We have written from the perspective of Bess the landlord's daughter or Tim the Ostler. This week, Year 6 have focussed on the active and passive voice, identifying this and using it in their own writing. Well done everyone, we are incredibly proud!

Year 6

In Year 6 this week, we have come together as a cohort to develop our mathematical facts as part of our work on reasoning. We thought about how we could develop our revision skills to remember key content such as lines, parts of a circle and angles in both triangles and quadrilaterals. We have created short, memorable actions to support us in the lead up to our assessments. In Grammar, we have been perfecting our knowledge of the active and passive voice – we will be using this knowledge as part of our weekly pop quiz – where we will be collaborating to play our SATs version of Who Wants to be a Millionaire. Our History unit has been incredibly powerful over the last term and we concluded our learning on Civil Rights this week: the children had a brilliant discussion, where we understood how the Black Lives Matter movement came to begin and we discussed the similarities and differences between the protests that took place in in Ferguson, Missouri and the Selma Marches we had learnt about during the 1960s. Well done Year 6 for a brilliant and thought-provoking week. Keep working hard and you will absolutely reap the rewards.
